CONSENT ORDER

Robert Arlington Unger, a licensed professional engineer (hereinafter referred to as “Respondent”) hereby stipulates and agrees, subject to approval of the Alabama Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors (hereinafter referred to as the “Board”) as follows:

STIPULATED FACTS

Respondent stipulates on December 3, 2004 the Board issued him certificate of licensure (number 15347) authorizing him to practice as a professional engineer in the State of Alabama.

Respondent stipulates on June 30, 2015 the Board, by and through its Executive Director, initiated a complaint alleging he failed to provide documents that support the professional development hours (pdh) he reported on his 2015 professional engineer license renewal application after being notified of his selection for audit of the reported pdh.

Respondent stipulates the Board sent an email on March 24, 2015 that advised his 2015 professional engineer license renewal application had been selected at random for audit of the reported pdh. Respondent stipulates the email instructed him to provide the pdh documents to the Board office prior to April 30, 2015. Respondent further stipulates he did not respond.

Respondent stipulates he was notified by the Board in a letter dated May 12, 2015 sent via first class mail that his 2015 professional engineer license renewal application had been selected at random for audit of the reported pdh. Respondent stipulates the letter instructed him to provide the pdh documents to the Board office prior to June 18, 2015.

Respondent stipulates he provided a letter to the Board office on June 22, 2015 that stated he could not provide the pdh documentation requested since he had not paid a registration fee to attend the professional development activities he reported on his 2015 license renewal application.

STIPULATED CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Respondent admits he is subject to the provisions of Title 34, Chapter 11, Code of Alabama 1975, § 34-11-11 and the jurisdiction of the Board.

Respondent stipulates his conduct as set forth in the foregoing “Stipulated Facts” constitutes violations of Title 34, Chapter 11, Code of Alabama 1975, § 34-11-11(a)(2) and the Rules and Regulations of the Board’s Administrative Code § 330-X-13-.02(14)(a) and § 330-X-14-.06(a)(1).

Respondent stipulates his conduct as set forth in the “Stipulated Facts” is a violation of those statutes set forth above, and it is subject to disciplinary action under Title 34, Chapter 11, Code of Alabama 1975, § 34-11-11.

STIPULATED DISPOSITION

Respondent understands this Consent Order and subsequent Final Order will become a matter of public record. Respondent further understands this information will be placed on the Board's website, in its newsletter, and posted to the National Council of Examiners for Engineers and Surveyors (NCEES) Enforcement Exchange.

Respondent agrees he will not in the future violate the provisions of Title 34, Chapter 11, Code of Alabama, or the Rules and Regulations of the Administrative Code of the Board and the

Rules of Professional Conduct promulgated together.

Respondent agrees to provide documentation of completion of fifteen professional development hours (pdh) to the Board prior to December 1, 2015. Respondent understands that failure to provide documentation of his completion of the (15) fifteen professional development hours to the Board prior to December 1, 2015 will cause his professional engineer license to be *revoked* pending ratification by the Board. Respondent further understands this matter would be presented to the Board at a regularly scheduled meeting at which he could attend and present evidence on his behalf.

Respondent understands his Alabama professional engineer license is suspended effective upon the Board issuing a Final Order, and will continue in suspended status until such time he provides documentation that indicates he has obtained (15) fifteen professional development hours. Respondent understands that during the suspension period he cannot practice, or offer to practice, engineering in the state of Alabama.

Respondent shall submit to the Board via a certified check made payable to PE/PLS Fund a fine in the amount of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500) with this signed Consent Order.

Respondent shall **cease and desist** attending professional development activities without providing the required payment.

Respondent understands this Consent Order is subject to the approval of the Board and has no force and effect until a Final Order based upon it is rendered by the Board.

Respondent agrees to comply with the terms of this Consent Order and understands failure to comply with the terms of the Consent Order may result in additional charges or discipline.

Respondent understands in order to make a decision relative to approving this Consent Order discussions must take place between Board Members, Board Staff and Board Counsel.


Respondent understands that this discussion will take place at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board.

Respondent understands he has the right to seek the advice of legal counsel. Respondent also understands he has the right to a formal fact finding hearing before the Board, to compel the testimony of witnesses, to cross-examine witnesses against him, and to obtain judicial review of the Board's decision in said formal hearing but expressly waives these rights with execution of this Consent Order and Final Order of the Board.

Respondent expressly waives all further procedural steps, and expressly waives all rights to seek judicial review or to otherwise challenge or contest the validity of the Consent Order, the stipulated facts, conclusions of law and imposition of administrative action contained herein, and the Final Order of the Board incorporating said Consent Order.

Respondent, for the purpose of avoiding further administrative action with respect to this cause executes this Consent Order. Should the Consent Order not be accepted by the Board, it is agreed that presentation to and consideration of the Consent Order by the Board shall not unfairly or illegally prejudice the Board or any of its members from further participation in or resolution of these proceedings. Likewise, if this Consent Order is not accepted, the Board shall not take into consideration the contents of this Order as evidence of an admission.


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FINAL ORDER


